At home:

Prizes:

- Your child will receive prizes to motivate him/her to love learning. On average your K-1 teacher spends about \$100 per week on prizes (\$4-6), stickers and awards, stamps, etc. Preferably, depending on the number of students, \$20 per week, would be a great help, if you have the means to do so.
